The region is home to Vitagora, one of Europe's leading agri-food innovation clusters with more than 660 members, including 60 multinationals and large businesses. It coordinates a regional network of 12,000 food science and healthcare researchers and engineers.

With its industrial specialisation, Bourgogne-Franche-Comté is an outstanding environment for experimentation, in particular for the development of agro-ecology providing answers to agricultural and ecological transition issues.

Driven by the agricultural production that represents the terroir, and with a solid reputation for quality, collaboration is everywhere in the agri-food industry thanks to a structured network of partners and infrastructure: experimental/phenotyping platforms, sensory analysis, and technical labs, etc. This ecosystem is perfect for hatching start-ups as well as developing mature businesses, who find within the network the support and expertise that places them on the cutting edge of research and innovation.

> Nuclear and conventional energies

For over 150 years, steam boilers, followed by nuclear boilers, as also both steam and gas turbines, have all been built here, and today they are used by 20% of the world's power stations and all of France's nuclear power stations.

The growth of this industry has brought new research laboratories and university courses specialising in energy-related studies, as well as developing robust competencies in engineering throughout the region. Bourgogne-Franche-Comté is now a major player in the Energy sector.

Hydrogen




Expanding the hydrogen sector has been one of the Bourgogne-Franche-Comté region's strategic goals for over 20 years now, a regional roadmap for this having been adopted in 2019, while in 2016 the region was awarded "Hydrogen Territory" status. The hydrogen sector is now backed by a fertile and pioneering academic base, with dynamic input from both industrial players and all its economic partners, local authorities, competitiveness clusters, etc. The hydrogen technology value chain is very much present across the region, innovating day after day, and encompassing areas from research, with the FCLAB for example, to projects for major clients.

An array of industrial projects has been developed over the last decade, with the emergence of start-ups, the setting up of industrial facilities, including an electrolyser Gigafactory, and the spontaneous creation of, or branching out into, new production or service activities for mid-market companies and SMEs... The Bourgogne-Franche-Comté Region is mobilising €100 million for the period 2020 - 2030, and the sector is also receiving support as part of the regional acceleration and innovation plan.

Forest & Timber

Bourgogne-Franche-Comté is one of France's most wooded regions – over a third of its land is forested, providing a rich reservoir of biodiversity. Forested land is also a source of economic wealth, with wood being used for material and energy purposes.

All the related sectors are present in the region: forest nurseries, forestry businesses, forest management, timber harvesting and transport, wood processing for construction and interior and exterior fittings, packaging, sawmills, cooperage, marquetry, wood energy and so on. Almost half of the people employed in the sector work in wood working companies, sawmills and timber construction firms.

The long-standing presence of world-class manufacturer Stellantis, with 15 different brands under its umbrella, is testimony to the region's well-established dynamism in this sector: Bourgogne-Franche-Comté, land of the automotive adventure. Stellantis chose Bourgogne-Franche-Comté to further boost its position, and its Sochaux site can produce 400,000 vehicles a year, making it an industry benchmark as Europe's highest performing plant. The region is also home to an array of specialist suppliers and global centres of excellence, such as Faurecia's R&D centre in Bavans.

Moreover, local resources are available to support all stakeholders in the sector, including research laboratories, engineering schools and business clusters operating in the mobility industry. The future of the automobile as a sustainable mobility solution is being written right now in Bourgogne-Franche-Comté, at the Pôle Véhicule du Futur competitiveness cluster.

> Soft mobility

Motivated by the cost of fuel, growing awareness of climate issues and the ease with which they can be used in town, scooters, cycles and other cargo bikes have gone from being a piece of sports equipment to a means of mobility in their own right. Now a complement to, or even an alternative to, the car, these forms of mobility have seen significant growth in recent years, and the trend is accelerating. The USC forecasts that bicycle sales will increase sixfold by 2030, driven by electrically assisted bicycles.

Bourgogne-Franche-Comté is a region that places soft mobility at the heart of its mobility strategy, with three conurbations equipped with fleets of self-service bicycles, 2,000 km of cycle paths and more than 850 clubs and associations.

Aeronautics

The region's businesses played an active role in the renaissance of the French aerospace industry in the wake of the Second World War. Jodel and Robin aircraft, to name just two, have contributed to the sector's growth, and helped make France the world's second leading country in numbers of pilots.

This industrial activity paved the way for innovation which can still be seen in the sector's ecological transition with several hybrid or hydrogen motorisation projects. Expertise in civil and military aviation and defence is built atop an industrial fabric with complementary technology skills.

It is a comprehensive sector: aircraft manufacturers and airport service and maintenance companies rub shoulders with a dense network of commercial and military aviation subcontractors.



The Bourgogne-Franche-Comté region lies at the crossroads of the major infrastructures linking Paris to Lyon and Marseille, and linking Spain to Germany. These infrastructures and the presence of qualified service providers attract numerous logistics and e-commerce platforms.

The Jura vineyard stretches some 2,000 hectares with four geographic AOCs (Arbois, Côtes-du-Jura, Château-Chalon, l'Étoile) and 3 AOC products (Macvin, Marc du Jura, Crémant du Jura).


